New Business

Duane Becker

- Ideas on providing supervision in stairwell between school entrance and cafeteria for before-school drop-offs
 - Crisis response team (CRT) found there are 15 minutes of unsupervised time (7:30-7:45) in this area before school for around 40 students; no line of sight from cafeteria to stairwell
 - Two viable options proposed that will be taken back to the CRT: 1) Other staff member(s) come 15 minutes early to supervise and could leave 15 minutes early; or 2) Have parents drop off students in back by cafeteria door; parents can watch students walk to the door and Ann Riley can buzz them in; suggestion of camera at that door to help with this likely the best idea
- Brief review of mock-up Preschool marketing brochure coming for Baptism Brunch on April 1 and for prospective families; Jane's class is completely full for next year

SFA Report

Duane reporting for Michelle Weber

- Parent/School meeting was held on March 7. Carolyn Bosn presented on the use of 2022 Walk for Christ funds, and Mr. Naumann presented on the technology fee
- Spirit Wear store now open through March 24
- SFA Picnic scheduled for Tuesday, May 2, from 6-8 pm
- Teacher Appreciation Week is May 8-12, and SFA is planning activities for the week

Unfinished Business

Duane Becker

- Catechesis of the Good Shepherd ongoing discussion and speakers
 - Megan Pytleski, parishioner and school parent
 - Trained in Level 1 for ages 3-6 and currently in training for Level 2 for ages 6-9
 - A little background on what CGS is, including that it's one approach to religious formation developed by Dr. Maria Montessori
 - Personal experience with CGS, being introduced through friends, getting involved at St. Teresa's, how it affects her and her children's faith lives, and the growth she has seen
 - Sessions in the atrium include presentations based on Scripture, liturgy, sacraments, etc. with reflection questions and student works related to presentations afterward
 - Sr. John Marion
 - Brief explanation of Dr. Maria Montessori's Four Planes of Development (attached)
 - Parents asked to have this program at St. Joseph's
 - Each 2nd Grade class goes to atrium with Sr. John Marion once a week for 90 minutes, which accounts for 2 days' worth of religious formation/education. Meanwhile, the other class has social studies/science, as well as spending extra time with, math, reading, etc. The remaining 3 days of the week have "regular" religious education.
 - Sr. John Marion is currently the only teacher trained in CGS at St. Joseph School, which is why it started with 2nd grade this year
 - Planning to expand into Preschool and Kindergarten next year with more parents and teachers getting trained over the summer
 - Has observed that this year's cohort has been much more excited about First Confession with significantly less anxiety
 - Invited anyone who wishes to see CGS in action to observe on Wednesdays from 4:15-5:30 pm
 - Kelly Baumgartner
 - 32 years of early childhood teaching experience; currently teaching special ed students and guiding the school through standardized testing that occurs every year
 - Affirms that this model is how children learn best
 - Only real concern is the time commitment and doing CGS well; suggested possibly replacing current religious education for PreK-2nd during the school day, or having CGS after school to include public school and homeschool families

- 90-minute blocks of time work, especially when they include instruction and hands-on learning activities
- Curious how CGS fits in with existing Sacramental prep

Discussion:

- Members shared comments on current use of CGS and the tension of determining where and how it best fits into the weekly curriculum and balancing the time constraints
- Teachers are not required to implement/incorporate CGS; logistics may be more challenging if grade partners do different things
- Plans for the future of CGS and whether to expand beyond 2nd Grade or keep it this age and younger for now? Growth and need are some factors that determine this
- Parents able to and encouraged to step in as atrium leaders if teachers unavailable or not interested at this time
- Currently have 3 trained parents with 3-5 parents and 5 teachers training this summer

Dr. Maria Montessori's 4 Planes of Development handout from Sr. John Marion:



Dr. Montessori's Four Planes of Development



Level I: (3-6 years old)

- The child's covenantal relationship with the Good Shepherd is forming
- Jesus as Good Shepherd
- Sensitive period: the child responds to gifts and falls in love with the Good Shepherd in a relationship of being *seen* and *known*
- Have an intense desire for the essential

Level II: (6-9 years)

- The child turns to ask, "If this great Love is mine, how do I respond? How do I live in His Kingdom?"
- Jesus as the Vine, and I am a branch connected to Him
- · Sensitive period: moral formation—recognizing their need for mercy and the steadfast love of God
- Have an intense desire for communion

Level III: (9-12 years)

- The child expands and deepens their desire to live both independently and in communion
- Jesus as the Vine who connects all people to Himself
- Sensitive period: vocational awareness begins—how am I called to make a gift of myself?
